He has already set up a WhatsApp group to keep members informed of social occasions and flying trips away. Within a couple of days, we have had a Friday get together and a few drinks in his hangar and six club aeroplanes to Great Barrier for breakfast. The club finally has resource consent for our summer irrigation system. This has been a battle led by Evan, taken many months and has cost \$32,000, all to take treated water from a pipe that runs under the airfield, that already irrigates the local sports fields and golf club, and would otherwise be fed into the sea. Evan has written a brief summary that follows.

He has also done a great job sourcing and carting new fencing materials for our new security fencing, work on which has already started. A brief summary of this from him follows.

We have an issue with the growth in the spouting of the hangars. Terry Boubee has very kindly cleared the northern side of the E block but said the grass was too wet for his scissor lift and that water blasting was required. Probably the best way to handle this is to get in "professionals" which will mean a small cost to individual hangar owners. Suggestions greatly appreciated.

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Fencing



Work on security fence commenced last week of May with it being erected over the following week. A general tidy up of the drain and finishing off landscaping will be completed once fence installed. The gate is to be constructed over next few weeks and will then be installed. This will then enclose the rear area of the hangar development project and provide some security.


We have finally received confirmation of a consent to irrigate the airfield from Environment Waikato, using treated wastewater from the TCDC treatment plant. At a cost of just on \$32000 for the paperwork side of the operation before we get into the next phase of purchasing holding bladder system and the laying of supply lines for the irrigator.

Now that we have a consent, we can start working on the actual project itself so we are ready to operate next summer. The consent allows us to operate daily from 1st December until 1st May year following as required for maintaining grass growth. As to be expected, the consent comes with a list of conditions.

Thats about it this time.



Wing Construction

Le Sueur, Toby and Dan are back on the building of our next wing. Today's tasks include riveting all the wing ribs to the spar, double checking their work and signing the task off, they then shifted their attention to finding the wiring for the wing, installing the wiring grommets and then running the wire through them. With four people on the job, the wiring was run in a jiffy.

Mid Fuselage Section

Sam and Kane are working with Graham, Alan and Jim on the mid fuselage section today. Their tasks today include fitting the aircraft control column, this is what the control stick will attach to. To make this part fit correctly, the paint needed to be removed from the mounting holes, in doing this makes the fitting much easier. Once the control column was in position, Sam was introduced to the washer pliers. These hold washers in place while a bolt is fed through the correct number of washers. It's a challenging task but one that only gets easier with experience.

Parts Preparation

Liam wasn't looking busy enough today, so he was tasked with preparing wing skins for undercoating. There were hundreds of holes that needed deburring! The plastic coating on the skins were particularly difficult to peel off today, some of the toughest we have come across. Liam also got reacquainted with the acid etching process, it's been a while since he's done it, but I don't think he missed it that much.
